Dear Parishioners,

It is with great joy that once again we celebrate the solemn feast of Easter. Jesus is Risen from the dead and Allelulia is our song! During this Holy Week, I was reflecting on the great witness given to us by those first Christians, who saw first hand the resurrection appearances of our Blessed Lord. What an awesome experience that must have been for them, to first have seen Jesus die on the Cross on Calvary, and then be raised up! Their faith was so strengthened, that they were willing to give up their lives, rather than give up their faith in Jesus, risen from the dead. One does not die for a fabrication; one does not offer their life in martyrdom for something that is not true. The witness of the martyrs reaches across the centuries to speak to us today of the Resurrection. And so we can truly rejoice: on the hill of Calvary Jesus suffered and died for our salvation and three days later Jesus rose from the dead and showed to us the way that leads to everlasting life.

My thanks to all who made our celebration of Holy Week so wonderful! Each day of the Sacred Triduum, brought us into another facet of the saving mysteries of our redemption. Our faith indeed gives us hope, and hope sustains our life.

Our capital campaign continues to go well. This week we hit a milestone and went over a half million dollars in pledges and donations. As of Monday morning we were at \$500,433.37. This week we will mail out to all parishioners who were not able to attend a reception, a packet of information concerning this campaign. We give according to the way we have been blest by God. Perhaps a sacrificial pledge for you could be \$25,000.00, \$50,000.00, or \$75,000.00 over three years. Perhaps you are able to pledge \$5,000.00, \$10,000.00, or \$15,000.00. Maybe your sacrifice is a pledge of \$1,000.00, or \$3,000.00, or \$4,000.00. Still others are able to make a sacrifice through a one time donation according to their ability. We all can't make the same pledge, but we all can share in the same sacrifice. Let us do so together, as a community of faith, so that our parish will be **SAFE AND SECURE FOR THE FUTURE!**
